Bench on East Lane residents want to be able to move around. Councillors agreed that it remain mobile.

Bench purchased earlier this year, to be collected and put temporarily at its agreed location on West Road.

Mrs Palin has retained teak oil for benches and is happy do benches. Also Mrs Palin has agreed to look after tree guards.

b) Planters – plants donated again by Hornsea Garden Centre. Mrs Palin will continue to care for planter on Hatfield Road Junction.

c) Parking at the Junction of Old Lane – Awaiting double yellow lines

d) Phone box - Phone box has undergone a refurbishment, the paint was purchased by the PC to do outside, Debbie Greenwood and her husband did inside, and Danny Collis did outside. Thanks go to all those who helped.

Cllr Hargreaves showed examples of photos for windows agreed that photos be chosen and agreed at the next meeting. Proposed Cllr Salvidge seconded Cllr Langley.

On the replacement tree for the corner nearest Hatfield Road, it was proposed and agreed that no replacement would be permitted due proximity to the electric post and access required for hedge cutting.

Proposed by Cllr Salvidge that a Wreath be purchased for placing on the War memorial on Remembrance Sunday seconded Cllr Rooms, all agreed.

Trees in hedge on The Crescent growing through Telephone wires, clerk to check on who is responsible for them and to copy Cllr Jefferson into correspondence.

Concern over use of E Scooters in the village by some younger residents, police have been asked to check and advise.
